Most people who have MO HealthNet or MO HealthNet managed care can get a ride to their health care appointments from the NEMT program. The NEMT program can be used when you do not have a way to your health care appointment without charge. The NEMT program may use public transportation or bus tokens, vans, taxi, ambulance, or even an airplane if necessary to get you to your health care appointment. You may also be able to get help with gas costs if you have a car, or have a friend or a neighbor who can take you. The NEMT program must okay this before your appointment. The mission of LIHEAP is to assist low-income households who have an energy related crisis. There are two parts to this program:

#### **Energy Assistance (EA)**

The Winter Heating Energy Assistance Program (EA) provides a one-time payment for assistance with winter heating costs for low-income households (based on household size and income). The program runs from

October through March. For more information about eligibility, visit the website above or call the number provided.

#### Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP)

The Winter Energy Crisis Intervention Program provides utility assistance and relief for eligible households to alleviate energy related crisis. The winter program runs from October through May. The Summer Energy Crisis Intervention Program provides assistance for electric payments only and runs from June through September.
